Clarinet Quintet in A, K.581 (1789) "Stadler-Quintett"



By 1789, Mozart had attained such mastery of form and affect that his operas, keyboard sonatas, church music, and symphonies had eclipsed those of every other composer in Imperial Vienna. He was just thirty-three. His chamber compositions from that wonderfully productive year embody heartrending beauty, but also night-dark richness. In their second concert for Music Matters, the New York Classical Quartet share their keen understanding of this composer in one of his great quartets. This is a concert not to miss!
