CT Gilbert & Sullivan Society~Excerpts from *Princess Ida***

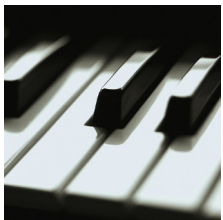

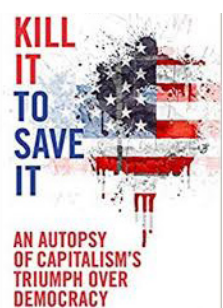

With Real McCoy Rum founder Bailey Pryor

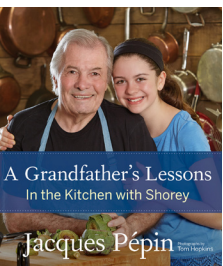
